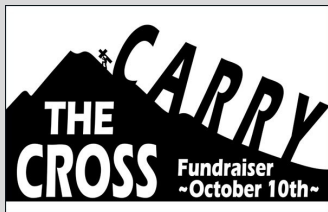
The Baby Bottle Benefit is a really simple way to raise funds to help provide vital services to clients facing unplanned pregnancies.

Fall Faith Formation

With prayer and discussion with Bishop Christian and the Faith Formation Committee, and with the recommendation of the Diocese of Manchester, it has been decided to temporarily offer a virtual option for the faith formation programs. (The GIFT program for grades Kindergarten through grade 5 and the Edge program for Grades 6,7, & 8.)

The GIFT program will be offered using Google Classroom through which the Gospel reading will be sent in a video format and a written format. Worksheets which the students can complete and return on Google Classroom as well as suggestions for the families will also be included each week. If for some reason you do not have Google Classroom, please contact Miss Janice (603-883-0757, ext. 4 or janicemercure@stjoenash.org) to make other arrangements. **The GIFT Program will begin the weekend of September 19th/20th, the Twenty Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time.**

We will continue to use the Edge program for grades 6,7, & 8. The Edge program will be offered on Sunday evenings from 6-7:30pm. We will be using ZOOM for the virtual sessions at least for the time being. The first session will be held on Sunday, September 20th.

You will be notified if and when we can safely bring the students together in person. The programs may look a little different in order to adhere to the guidelines at the time. Prior to the start of in person sessions, you will be sent the details, in order for you to familiarize yourself and to be comfortable with the new procedures.

For those families who had children preparing to receive First Reconciliation, Confirmation and or First Communion last spring, the celebration of these sacraments will be held later this fall. Dates will be sent to you in the near future. Thank you for your patience and cooperation.

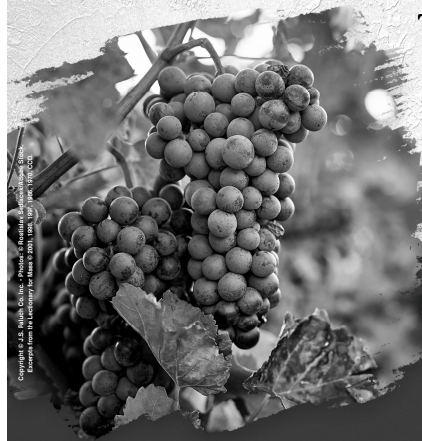
NEW: Everyone Loves Gift Cards!

REFLECTIONS

There is a story about a group of shipwrecked people adrift in a long, narrow lifeboat. The boat is so long that people in the front think of themselves as the “front” people and those in back think of themselves as the “back” people. One day the front of the boat develops an uncontrollable leak. A man in the back of the boat says to the woman next to him, “Thank God that leak is in the front. If it were in the back, we’d be doomed.” That story contains an important lesson for all of us. The world is our boat and we are all in it together. More than ever before in history we understand hopefully, that when something happens somewhere else in the world it affects all of us in one way or another, big or small. When COVID-19 started in China, it didn’t stay there, as we all too sadly know. If the rain forest in the Amazon doesn’t produce enough oxygen, we all will suffer. If the ice caps in the polar regions melt, the whole world will be affected. If people in one part of our country are denied their human rights or find it impossible to receive justice, the foundations of our society are weakened for all of us. St. Paul’s famous teaching about the Body is applicable here. He says that each one of us is a member of the Body of Christ and we all have our own function to perform. If we don’t fulfill it well, then the whole body is diminished. As Martin Luther King, Jr. said so tellingly, “We must learn to live together as brothers and sisters or perish together as fools.”

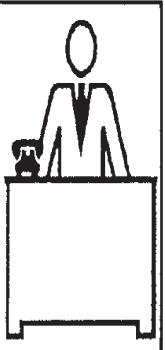


Ordinary Time: September 29th

Feast of Sts. Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, Archangels

The liturgy celebrates the feast of these three archangels who are venerated in the tradition of the Church. Michael (Who is like God?) was the archangel who fought against Satan and all his evil angels, defending all the friends of God. He is the protector of all humanity from the snares of the devil. Gabriel (Strength of God) announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. His greeting to the Virgin, "Hail, full of grace," is one of the most familiar and frequent prayers of the Christian people. Raphael (Medicine of God) is the archangel who took care of Tobias on his journey.

Angels are pure, created spirits. The name angel means servant or messenger of God. Angels are celestial or heavenly beings, on a higher order than human beings. Angels have no bodies and do not depend on matter for their existence or activity. They are distinct from saints, which men can become. Angels have intellect and will, and are immortal. They are a vast multitude, but each is an individual person. Archangels are one of the nine choirs of angels listed in the Bible. In ascending order, the choirs or classes are 1) Angels, 2) Archangels, 3) Principalities, 4) Powers, 5) Virtues, 6) Dominations, 7) Thrones, 8) Cherubim, and 9) Seraphim
